

Readmission and Admission Criteria

Round I: Readmission

Academic Performance (50%) + College Participation (50%)

Part I: Academic Performance (50%)

Part Ia: CGPA – For undergraduates

CGPA Score, total = 100

Calculation: $CGPA \div 0.043$ (Conversion to 100 marks)

Part Ib: Research Outcome – For postgraduates

Postgraduate residents applying for readmission should be able to clearly elaborate their research progress, outcome and outlook during the readmission interview for tutorial team's consideration.

Part II: College Participation (50%)

Merit Score: High Table Dinner Attendance (10%) + Participation in College Staff-led Cluster Events (20%) + Tutors' Evaluation (20%)

Part IIa: High Table Dinner Attendance (10%)

Attend all High Table Dinners organised within the academic year, unless reasonably excused.

1. Residents attended all High Table Dinners will be awarded full marks.
2. Residents should inform the Master and their floor tutor of their absence at least two weeks in advance.
3. Residents with proper reasons of absence will be given half of the marks.

Part IIb: Participation in College Committees and Events (20%)

1. Serving as a member of committee, sub-committee and working group (10%)

2. Participation in College & community events, especially those related to the College's theme on sustainability (10%)

Part IIc: Tutors' Evaluation (20%)

1. Tutors' Evaluation
 - a. Relationship with other students
 - b. Initiative
 - c. Attitude
 - d. Responsibility
 - e. Helpfulness in College matters
 - f. Misbehaviors

Round II: Admission

For undergraduates: Need Score (50%) + Interview (50%)

For postgraduates: One-page CV (50%) + Interview (50%)

Part I: Need Score (50%) – For undergraduates

Need Score, total = 100

(Distance Score [80, this will increase to 100 if a student's daily two-way travelling exceeds 3-hr] and Home Condition [20, e.g., physical space])

Part I: One-page CV (50%) – For postgraduates

Applicants should list out their academic achievements, such as research outcomes, academic papers/journals published, etc., for tutorial team's consideration.

Part II: Interview (50%)

1. Interview Performance
 - a. Preparation for interview
 - b. Punctuality
 - c. Previous hall/college experience (if applicable)
 - d. Willingness to participate in College matters
 - e. Attitude during the interview

Remarks:

Weighting may apply when the admission scheme is more mature after a few readmission cycles or when there's a need for sorting the students that are in more urgent need of a residential space due to the overwhelming number of applications.

As senior students have more knowledge about Hong Kong which puts them in a better position in finding their own accommodation in the community, the relative weighting of need, n in the equation, should diminish as the student progresses. The following tables shows the relative weightings over the study period of various type of students:

1. m = weighting of merit; n = weighting of need
2. Principle 5 in document 113/409, the New Hall Admission Scheme effectively specifies two small percentages for assigning $m=1$ & $n=0$, and $m=0$ & $n=1$ to small percentages of students.

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
