1. Academic and Career Cluster

Overview

This section highlights the activities organised under the Academic and Career Cluster during the 2024–2025 academic year. These initiatives aimed to provide students with insights into pathways to their academic and career development and to create college-wide academic support.

Academic & Career Development Events

Fireside Chat

"Navigating the Transition between Academia and Industry as a PhD"

Date: 18 November 2024

Venue: Co-working Space, JCSV IV

The first event was joined by two speakers, Dr. Cynthia Shum, an HKU PhD Graduate in Microbiology, and Mr. Liam Reeve, an HKU Presidential PhD Scholar in Geography. The session involved a presentation from each guest speaker, where they shared their unique experiences in navigating the transition between academia and industry. This was followed by an in-depth panel discussion focusing on the reasons, advantages, and disadvantages of their decisions. The event was well-received, with an attendance of approximately 15 students.






Sharing Session

"Pathways to Global Academia: Navigating the Journey to Overseas Doctoral Studies"

Date: 17 February 2025

Venue: Co-working Space at JCSV IV

This event featured Dr. May Chim, a Postdoctoral Researcher at the University of Exeter, and Ms. Jay Mok, a DPhil Candidate at the University of Oxford. The speakers delivered presentations on their experiences in studying overseas and the process of applying for international scholarships. They also discussed lifestyle changes, academic pressures, and the opportunities and challenges that accompany studying abroad. The session was conducted in a hybrid format, accommodating both in-person and online attendees. Approximately 10 students joined the sharing session.



Residential Student Academic Advisor Program

During this academic year, College Two recruited 15 students to serve as Student Academic Advisors. An introductory session was conducted in November 2024 to familiarise these Advisors with the program's structure and expectations. The Advisors also participated in a briefing session organised by CEDARS. They were expected to conduct academic advising sessions for College freshmen in the 2025–2026 academic year.

College freshmen and the Advisors were invited to attend an introduction and meet-up session on 25 March 2025. It was the first arranged meet-up of the program. The tutor responsible for the program introduced the program and the academic advising resources available to the freshmen. This was followed by a sharing session by the Advisors. The meet-up concluded with a networking session between the freshmen and the Advisors.





Concluding Remarks

The Academic and Career Cluster successfully implemented various enriching initiatives during this academic year, providing students with insights and guidance on various aspects of academia and industry. We also addressed the needs of the undergraduates in the College, where academic advising is a major need. We look forward to continuing these efforts in the upcoming year with the hope of increasing student participation and addressing the needs of all residents in the College, both undergraduates and postgraduates.

5. Sustainability Cluster

Overview

This cluster aims to help students develop an overall understanding of the importance of sustainability (environmental, economic, social, and cultural) for humanity and our planet, and encourage students to align their professional and personal goals with the relevant UNSDGs of their interests.

Events and Activities

In the first semester, the Cluster invited Gavin Coates, a Senior Lecturer at HKU's Division of Landscape Architecture, to offer two events centered around the theme "Nature in the City."

(1) Workshop: 26 October 2024

The event took place in the Co-Working Space of HKU JCSV IV from 14:30 to 16:00. More than ten attendees participated in the event. Gavin emphasised the significance of the relationship between nature and the city. He explored how this relationship reflects the complex and contradictory interconnections between humans and nature, and its impact on our physical, mental, and environmental health. Drawing from his 45 years of work experience as a landscape architect and 10 years of teaching at HKU's Division of Landscape Architecture, he encouraged the audience to contemplate their relationship with nature and consider their potential long-term roles as citizens, scientists, artists, and more. Attendees shared their thoughts, engaging in lively discussions during the tea and snack break.



(2) Walking Tour: 23 November 2024

The walking tour entitled "HK Street Tree Guided Tour: Nature in the City", lasting two-hour, attracted more than ten participants. During the tour, Gavin shared the story of street trees in Tsim Sha Tsui, which spans over 100 years. He pointed out the benefits and challenges of some of Hong Kong's oldest trees and explained what is needed to plant new ones. He emphasised how these new trees could improve the city and support the mental and physical health of future generations. Students enjoyed learning about the importance of trees in urban life.



In the second semester of 2024-2025, the sustainability cluster team at College Two invited Professor JIANG Bin from HKU's Division of Landscape Architecture to organise two events centered around the theme "Contact with Nature and Mental Health".

(1) Sustainability Workshop: 1 March 2025

The event was held between 14:30 and 16:30, with the titled "Impact of Urban Green on Health and Sustainability," led by Professor JIANG Bin. The Master, the Tutorial Team, and residents attended this interactive session, which was held in the college's Co-Working Space. Professor JIANG introduced five key mechanisms through which urban green spaces contribute to both individual well-being and environmental sustainability: the promotion of social capital, reduction of stress, recovery from fatigue, facilitation of physical activities, and provision of ecological services and products. Through engaging presentations and open discussion, participants gained a deeper understanding of how thoughtfully designed urban greenery can foster healthier communities and sustainable urban environments. The session concluded with refreshments, providing an opportunity for attendees to share their reflections and discuss ideas for enhancing green spaces within the residential college.





(2) Design Workshop: 22 March 2025

The second workshop offered by Professor JIANG was entitled "Creating a Restorative Living Environment" and took place at 14:30–16:30 in the Co-Working Space of HKU JCSV IV. The Master, the Tutorial Team, and nine residents from different floors attended this workshop. During the session, Professor JIANG emphasised the importance of creating a restorative urban landscape and shared his experiences in doing so across various environments. In the final twenty minutes, he encouraged all participants to redesign the HKU main campus to be a more restorative living environment based on their personal preferences. Each participant explained the rationale behind her or his design. Following the workshop, while enjoying drinks and refreshments, the attendees shared their thoughts about the workshop with each other.
